

## John and the Cross — notes #6

**John 19** <sup>25</sup> Now there stood by the cross of Jesus His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. <sup>26</sup> When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved (τὸν μαθητὴν . . . ὃν ἠγάπα.) standing by, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son!" <sup>27</sup> Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own (καὶ ἀπ' ἐκείνης τῆς ὥρας ἔλαβεν ὁ μαθητὴς αὐτὴν εἰς τὰ ἴδια).

**John 3** <sup>29</sup> He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the bridegroom's friend (ὁ δὲ φίλος τοῦ νυμφίου), who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly because of the bridegroom's voice.

**John 11** <sup>11</sup> He said to them, "Our friend (ὁ φίλος ἡμῶν) Lazarus sleeps, but I go that I may wake him up."

**John 15** <sup>12</sup> This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you (ἀγαπάτε ἀλλήλους καθὼς ἠγάπησα ὑμᾶς). <sup>13</sup> Greater love (ἀγάπην) has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends (ὑπὲρ τῶν φίλων αὐτοῦ). <sup>14</sup> You are my friends (φίλοι μου) if you do whatever I command you. <sup>15</sup> No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends (ὑμᾶς δὲ εἵρηκα φίλους), for all things that I heard from my Father I have made known to you.

**John 10** <sup>2</sup> But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. <sup>3</sup> To him the doorkeeper opens, and the sheep hear his voice; and he calls his own sheep (τὰ ἴδια πρόβατα) by name and leads them out. <sup>4</sup> And when he brings out his own (τὰ ἴδια), he goes before them; and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. . . . <sup>14</sup> I am the good shepherd; and I know mine and mine know me (γινώσκω τὰ ἐμὰ καὶ γινώσκουσί με τὰ ἐμὰ).

**John 13** <sup>1</sup> Now before the feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come that he should depart from this world to the Father, having loved his own (ἀγαπήσας τοὺς ἰδίους) who were in the world, he loved them to the end (εἰς τέλος ἠγάπησεν αὐτούς).

**John 10** <sup>11</sup> I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.

**John 13** <sup>34</sup> A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another — ἐντολὴν καινὴν δίδωμι ὑμῖν ἵνα ἀγαπάτε ἀλλήλους, καθὼς ἠγάπησα ὑμᾶς ἵνα καὶ ὑμεῖς ἀγαπάτε ἀλλήλους

**1 John 3** <sup>16</sup>By this we have known love (ἐγνώκαμεν τὴν ἀγάπην), because he (ἐκεῖνος) laid down his life (τὴν ψυχὴν) for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives (τὰς ψυχὰς) for the brethren.

**1 John 4** <sup>7</sup>Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. <sup>8</sup>He who does not love does not know God, for God is love. <sup>9</sup>In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. <sup>10</sup>In this is love, not that we have loved (ἠγάπηκαμεν) God, but that he loved (ἠγάπησεν) us and sent his Son [as] the offering (ἱλασμὸν) for our sins. <sup>11</sup>Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

**John 21** <sup>15</sup>So when they had eaten breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “Simon Johnson., do you love me (ἀγαπᾷς με) more than these?”

He said to him, “Yes, Lord, you know that I love you (φιλῶ σε).”

He said to him, “Feed my lambs.”

<sup>16</sup>He said to him again a second time, “Simon Johnson, do you love me (ἀγαπᾷς με)?”

He said to him, “Yes, Lord; You know that I love you (φιλῶ σε).”

He said to him, “Tend my sheep.”

<sup>17</sup>He said to him the third time, “Simon Johnson, do you love me (φιλεῖς με)?”

Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, “Do you love me (φιλεῖς με)?”

And he said to him, “Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you (φιλῶ σε).”

Jesus said to him, “Feed my sheep.”
