Handout: 1C. Creation & Christology

Nicene Creed — I believe in one God (Θεόν), the Father Almighty (Πατέρα παντοκράτορα), maker of heaven and earth, and of all visible things and invisible (ὑρατῶν τε πάντων καὶ ἀοράτων).

Acts 4 ²⁴ [T]hey they raised their voice to God with one accord and said: "Lord ($\Delta \acute{\epsilon} \sigma \pi \sigma \tau \alpha$), thou hast made heaven and earth and the sea, and all ($\pi \acute{\alpha} v \tau \alpha$) that is in them, ²⁵ who through the Holy Spirit, by the mouth of our father, thy servant David, hast said: 'Why did the nations rage . . .

Acts 17 ²³ Therefore, the One whom you worship without knowing, him I proclaim to you: ²⁴ God, who made the cosmos and all things ($\dot{o} \pi o n \dot{n} \sigma \alpha \varsigma$ to v koupov kal $\pi \dot{\alpha} v \tau \alpha$) in it, since he is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands. ²⁵ Nor is he worshiped with men's hands, as though he needed anything, since he gives to all life, breath, and all things ($\tau \dot{\alpha} \pi \dot{\alpha} v \tau \alpha$).

LXX Gen 2.1 — And heaven and earth were perfectly put together (συνετελέσθησαν) and all their cosmos (πâς ἡ κόσμος αὐτῶν).

Nicene Creed — ... and in one Lord (εἰς ἕνα Κύριον), Jesus Christ ... through whom all things came to be (δι' οὖ τὰ πάντα ἐγένετο).

1 Corinthians 8⁶... for us there is one God (εἶς θεὸς), the Father, from whom are all things (ἐξ οὖ τὰ πάντα), and we unto him (ἡμεῖς εἰς αὐτόν); and one Lord (εἶς κύριος), Jesus Christ, through whom are all things (δι' οὖ τὰ πάντα), and we through him.

John 1¹ In the beginning was the Word . . . ³ through him all things came to be ($\pi \dot{\alpha} v \tau \alpha \delta i' \alpha \dot{v} \tau c \hat{v} \dot{\epsilon} v \dot{\epsilon} \tau c \delta$).

Hebrews 1 ¹ God, who at various times and in sundry ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, ² has in these last days spoken to us by a Son, whom he has appointed heir of all things, through whom also he made ($\delta\iota$ ' où kaù ἐποίησεν) the ages.

O COME, let us sing unto the LORD; * let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving; * and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.

For the LORD is a great God; * and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth; * and the strength of the hills is his also.

The sea is his, and he made it; * and his hands prepared the dry land.

O come, let us worship and fall down, * and kneel before the LORD our Maker.

For he is the Lord our God; * and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.
